When strange things begin to happen at work, Charlie becomes paranoid because he can't remember doing them. Soon he can't tell if he's becoming like his schizophrenic brother, or someone is really out to get him. Could he really murder someone and not remember?

This is full adrenalin with an incredible "can't put it down" plot. It's not surprising that Daniel is the son of bestselling author Michael Palmer.

Cypress House

Traveling to Florida by train with a young man named Paul, WW I veteran Arlen Wagner senses impending danger when he "sees" the other men in their CCC (Civilian Conservation Corps) group turn to bones. Arlen makes Paul get off the train with him and they end up in a remote Florida town immersed in the nefarious dealings of a crooked sheriff and local judge. As they seek temporary shelter from a hurricane, Arlen must come to terms with his gift of second sight as well as deal with Rebecca, the feisty young woman who runs Cypress House on the Florida Coast.

The San Francisco police suspect the scion of a wealthy newspaper publishing family when a crime spree, targeting individuals instrumental in the young man's original conviction, spontaneously erupts following his release from prison on a technical ruling by the appellate court.

Sprinkled with familiar characters from his previous works, the author's alarming narrative is sufficiently well-crafted to stand alone. So compelling, it literally incites the reader to grapple with the age-old question—does the end justify the means?

Journalist Richard Kilmer is on top of the world. He has just travelled to upstate New York to meet his fiancée Jennifer's parents and announce their wedding plans. The Janus Stone

Griffith's writing captures an atmospheric northern England as well as troubled and complex characters. Suspenseful and fast-paced, it's the second in a series.

However, there are other missions, secrets, and relationships happening inside the compound that conflict with the order.
