



As he delves further into the lives of the Jankos, traveling Gypsies with no end of secrets and tragedies, he begins to suspect that Ivo, Rose's husband, had a hand in her disappearance. Meanwhile, J.J., Ivo's nephew, narrates his experiences growing up amidst the clan-nishness and enigmas of the Janko family.

### **A Winter Haunting**

Camping out at Duane's long unoccupied house, even sleeping in Duane's bedroom, he begins to get cryptic messages on his computer, visits from packs of black dogs, and threats from local neo-Nazis.
